Neighbourhood Policing Panel Priorities

The Neighbourhood Policing Panel Priorities for the Comberton Panel part of Cambourne Neighbourhood were set on the 18th November for period to the 24th February 2010. These are:

- To continue targeted traffic enforcement in order to reduce all traffic offences including speeding, use of mobile phones whilst driving and lack of insurance/tax; focusing on Hinds Lane and Green End in Comberton. As well as The Green, St. Neots Rd and Potten End in Eltisbury. In Barton, enforcement to be carried out on the 30 mph areas in Comberton Rd and Haslingfield Rd.

Police Enhancement Access Line

Cambridge Police have now launched a dedicated phone number for people with communication difficulties. The police enhancement access line (PEAL) is available 24 hours a day for non-emergency calls for anyone who has a communication difficulty.

Those wanting to use the system must register first to ensure their details are already in the system. They will then be given the dedicated number which will allow them to contact a specially trained call taker. The scheme can be used for all non-emergency calls.
